Per OSHA, This “General Industry” compliance course is designed to present detailed information about how the provisions of the Occupational Safety and Health Act (OSHAct) may/must be implemented in the workplace, not only to achieve OSHA compliance, but to achieve profitability and survivability in today’s cost-conscious environment. We will introduce attendees to the OSHA standards that govern General Industry, explain how to read and use the Code of Federal Regulations (CFRs), and provide an overview of compliance programs and procedures that are required for the workplace. Topics covered are intended for all private sector personnel, and those public sector employers who utilize Federal OSHA standards as directed by state requirements.

Who Should Attend: Workers with some safety responsibility.

What They Will Learn: Information about their rights, employer responsibilities, and how to file a complaint as well as how to identify, abate, avoid and prevent job-related hazards on a job site. The training covers a variety of general industry safety and health hazards which a worker may encounter. Training should emphasize hazard identification, avoidance, control and prevention, not OSHA standards.

OSHA MANDATES 13 HOURS SPECIFIC TRAINING AS FOLLOWS:

2 hours -Introduction to OSHA

- Workers’ rights, employer responsibilities and how to file a complaint
- Helpful worker safety and health resources
- Samples of a weekly fatality and 3 catastrophe report, material data safety sheet and the OSHA Log of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses
- Materials include an Instructor Guide, PowerPoint slides, student handouts, and participatory activities

2 hours -Managing Safety and Health (May include Injury and Illness Prevention Programs, Job Site Inspections, Accident Prevention Programs, Management Commitment and Employee Involvement, Worksite Analysis, Hazard Prevention and Control, Accident 4 Investigations, How to Conduct Safety Meetings, and Supervisory Communication.)

1 hour - Walking and Working Surfaces, including Fall Protection

2 hours -Exit Routes, Emergency Action Plans, Fire Prevention Plans, and Fire

2 hours -Electrical

1 hour - Personal Protective Equipment

2 hours -Materials Handling

1 hour - Hazard Communication

10 hours -ELECTIVE: Students select a minimum of 30 minutes training on at least five of the following topics

- Hazardous Materials (Flammable and Combustible Liquids, Spray Finishing, Compressed Gases, Dipping and Coating Operations)
- Permit-Required Confined Spaces
- Lockout / Tagout
- Machine Guarding
- Welding, Cutting, and Brazing
- Introduction to Industrial Hygiene
- Bloodborne Pathogens
- Ergonomics
- Fall Protection

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- Safety and Health Programs
- Powered Industrial Vehicles

7 hours - OPTIONAL: Teach other general industry hazards or policies and/or expand on the mandatory or elective topics. The minimum length of any topic is one-half hour.

Certification:

Successful completion requires 80% on both classroom and practical skills.

Upon successful completion, participants receive a wallet card, documentation to satisfy OSHA.
